WEST SIDE LUMBER HEISLER #3



The prototype for our 3-foot narrow gauge West Side Lumber Co. Heisler #3 was built in 1899 for the West Side Flume & Lumber Company, and given the name "Thomas S. Bullock". It served as a mainline and logging engine on both the West Side Lumber Co. and Hetch Hetchy & Yosemite Valley railroads. The loco carried 160 lbs of boiler pressure, weighed 74,000 lbs, and was able to exert 14,000 lbs of tractive effort. Utilizing longer axles, WSL #3 was converted to standard gauge in 1947 for use as the West Side Lumber's mill switcher for many years. In 1962, the locomotive was sold to the Roaring Camp & Big Trees Railroad in Felton, California as their #2 and converted back to 3-foot gauge. This Heisler loco is still in operation there today!


